

IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR VISITORS:

What to do when visiting a patient who has or may have COVID-19

You are visiting a patient who has or may have COVID-19, which is a new virus that causes fever, cough, or shortness of breath and cause serious health complications.

Anyone who goes into this room is at risk of getting sick with this virus.

For your safety, we are giving you the same kind of protection as you see the staff wearing when you go into the room. This will make sure you stay as safe as possible.

Our staff will show you how to put on and take off the protection. For your safety, you need to do this the exact same way as you are shown. It is very important that you do not change the way you do this in any way. You must wear the protection for the entire time you are in the room.

After you take off your protection and leave the room, you must wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds or use hand sanitizer.

Please ask any of our staff if you have questions about what you need to do.

To be safe, we also advise you to be aware of how you feel and watch for any symptoms for 14 days after the last day you visit this patient. If you come down with a fever, start to cough, or feel shortness of breath, please contact your doctor right away.
